



Christian Mair has been a Professor of English Linguistics at the University of Freiburg in Germany since 1990. His research over the past three decades has focussed on the corpus-based description of modern English grammar and on variability and change in Standard Englishes world-wide. It has resulted in the publication of several monographs (among them *Infinitival clauses in English: a study of syntax in discourse*, 1990, and *Twentieth-century English: history, variation, and standardization*, 2006) and more than 100 contributions to scholarly journals and edited works. Mair's current research focusses on the role of global English in a multilingual world, on multilingual and nonstandard language practices in computer-mediated communication, and on the sociolinguistics of diaspora and migration. From 2011 to 2014 he served as President of ISLE, the International Society for the Linguistics of English.
